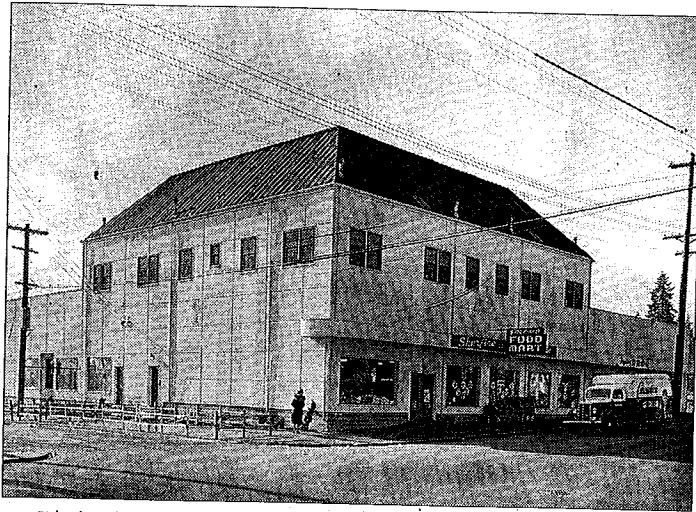

100 YEARS AGO TODAY: NOV. 4, 1909

Plans have been completed and work will soon be started on the seven-story addition to the Kentucky Building at 12th Street and Pacific Avenue owned by Peter Sandberg. The new building will be a replica of the present structure and will cost \$300,000.

75 YEARS AGO TODAY: NOV. 4, 1934

Nick Dybdahl of Bremerton agrees with friends that he apparently has a "charmed" life, after he was practically killed Sunday evening when his car rolled completely over the edge of a 60-foot embankment at the edge of Pioneer Way highway on the west bank of the Puyallup River. Dybdahl became confused during a heavy rain shower while driving over a road with which he was unfamiliar. He lost control of the car's wheel in the tumbling descent and was able to stop unaided when the car finally halted near the river's bank.

50 YEARS AGO TODAY: NOV. 4, 1959

Tacoma's newest and most modern auto dealership, Everett Stevens Motor Co., will celebrate its grand opening starting Thursday with the showing of the newest of the family-size economy cars, the Valiant, and the solid Plymouth for 1960.
